



**Lieutenant Colonel Michael J. Devine III**  
Product Manager

LTC Michael J. Devine III was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Signal Corps in May 1992 from the Reserve Officer Training Corps at Gonzaga University in Spokane, Washington. He subsequently graduated the Signal Officer Basic Course at Ft. Gordon, Georgia and was assigned as a platoon leader, from March 1993 until July 1994, in the 141<sup>st</sup> Signal Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> Armored Division at Bad Kreuznach, Germany. LTC Devine later served as the Assistant S3 (Operations) for the 141<sup>st</sup> Signal Battalion during Operation Joint Endeavor (IFOR).

LTC Devine graduated the Signal Officer Advanced Course in September 1996, and afterwards served as the Signal Officer for the Division Artillery, 10<sup>th</sup> Mountain Division (Light) at Ft. Drum, New York. He assumed command of A Company, 10<sup>th</sup> Signal Battalion, 10<sup>th</sup> Mountain Division (Light) in November 1997. In 1999, LTC Devine relinquished command and joined the 7<sup>th</sup> Corps Support Group, 3<sup>rd</sup> Corps Support Command as the Brigade Signal Officer during Operation Allied Force at Tirana, Albania and later at Bamberg, Germany.

In December 2002, LTC Devine graduated with a Masters Degree of Science in Systems Acquisition Management from the Naval Postgraduate School at Monterey, California and was assigned as the Chief, Force Integration, for the Project Executive Office, Enterprise Information Systems (PEO EIS) at Ft. Belvoir, Virginia. In April 2003, LTC Devine was reassigned as the Assistant Product Manager, Defense Wide Transmission Systems and served as PM for two satellite communications networks serving the CFLCC C4 and CFLCC Surgeon during Operation Iraqi Freedom. At the direction of the HQDA ACoS G4, LTC Devine's team later developed and fielded the worldwide CSS Satellite Communications Network that provides tactical STAMIS connectivity for all Army logistics units.

LTC Devine graduated CGSOC in 2005 and was then assigned to the Project Executive Office for Command, Control, Communications and Technology (PEO C3T) at Ft. Lewis, Washington. Enroute to his assignment there, the HQDA ACoS G4 Director of Readiness diverted LTC Devine to the JTF Katrina Joint Logistics Command at New Orleans, Louisiana to lead a multi-

disciplinary team, representing multiple product managers, in the establishment of an in-transit visibility network for Hurricane Katrina relief supplies flowing from Baton Rouge to New Orleans.

In October 2005, LTC Devine became the PEO C3T test officer responsible for synchronizing the combined operational tests for the Joint Network Node, Command Post Platforms, Command Post of the Future, Blue Force Tracker and the Army Battle Command Systems version 6.4. Upon completion of the operational test with 2/1CD at the National Training Center and III Corps at Ft. Hood Texas, LTC Devine was reassigned as the Assistant Project Manager Battle Command (Field Support). In September of 2007, LTC Devine became the Executive Officer for the 406<sup>th</sup> Army Field Support Brigade at Ft. Bragg, NC.

LTC Devine's awards include the Meritorious Service Medal (5), the Army Commendation Medal (3), the Army Achievement Medal (4), the National Defense Service Medal (2), the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, the Global War on Terror Service Medal, the Kosovo Campaign Medal, the Armed Forces Service Medal, the Humanitarian Service Medal (2), the NATO Medal (2), the Army Superior Unit Award, and the Army Parachutist Badge. LTC Devine has also been awarded the Secretary of the Army Acquisition Excellence Award (2005) and CIO G6 Information Management Excellence Award (2006).

Lieutenant Colonel Devine and his wife Tami have two daughters, Courtney and Kayla and live in Pinehurst, NC. LTC Devine currently serves as the Product manager for Area Processing Centers in the Program Executive Office for Enterprise Information Systems.
